
#### Introduction to knowledge organisers

One way that we do this is by using knowledge organisers.




Your knowledge organiser is an essential part of your equipment that you <u>must</u> keep safe.

Write the name of the subject and underline it. Then write the new key word.

Repeat the 'read, cover, write and check' process. In this case, it's for the phrase 'design brief'.

Correct your answers in green pen.

Repeat the process for the next 5 rows in your knowledge organiser.

Remember: you will need to practice any incorrect definitions again.



# How will I retain the words and definitions?



Each week you will complete a quiz on Microsoft Forms to assess the words you have learnt from the previous week.

For example, Year 8 will be quizzed on week 1 words on Thursday of week 2.

In total, you should be memorising **12** words and definitions every week. You should therefore also be completing practice for homework.
